Starting Thursday, April 10 and continuing through Saturday, April 12, is Reunion Weekend for our College of Medicine. There will be presentations and tours on Friday, April 11, as well as a celebration of five-year alumni anniversary groups that evening. It is a time when each reunion class can celebrate together and/or renew friendships. It is always enjoyable to welcome back those who graduated 50 years ago and, in particular, to honor them.

We will also take time Friday night to honor three Distinguished Alumni Award winners: Arthur Evans, MD (Med '74), Sheldon Greenfield, MD (Med '64) and Clarice Reid, MD (Med '59). Their names will be added to the Distinguished Alumni wall across from the Winkler Center for the History of the Health Professions.

Our recognition of accomplished alumni doesn't end with Alumni Weekend. On Memorial Day weekend, and as a part of our Honors Day festivities, we will be awarding our annual Daniel Drake medals. In the last two years, three alumni have been honored with this very special recog-

nition. Two years ago Dr. Greenfield, nationally recognized as a pioneer in health services research and quality improvement initiatives, was a Drake awardee. Last year, Robert Rakel, MD (Med '58), the founding chair of three departments of family medicine and the editor of the "Textbook of Family Medicine," and Taylor Asbury, MD (Med '49), who established UC's ophthalmology residency program, were honored as Drake medalists.

This year two additional alumni will receive Drake Medals. John O' Shea, MD (Med '78), head of the National Institutes of Health's Intramural Program of Molecular Immunology and scientific director of the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases, and Richard Steketee, MD (Med '76), science director for the Malaria Control Program at PATH CDC, will be honored with medals at the awards dinner to be held Sunday, May 25.

Our Honors Day speaker for Sunday, May 25, will be **Scott Rauch, MD (Med '87)**. Dr. Rauch is the CEO, chair and psychiatrist-in-chief of the McLean Hospital, the internationally known facility in Boston for psychiatric care.
