 - 145,000 meals including dine-in and take-out
 - 400 people








Decreased Accessibility: COVID-19

- Pandemic restricted availability of resources for individuals experiencing homelessness.
- Many nearby resources struggled to adjust to safety guidelines, a lack of volunteers, and loss of funding.
- 22% increase in homelessness since the beginning of the pandemic.
- 15% of Cincinnati's population has experienced homelessness
- While the community is slowly recovering from the effects of the pandemic, there are still some gaps







Our Project


- How did the pandemic alter availability of these resources?
- How should Our Daily Bread respond?
- Survey conducted over 2 days
 - 58 responses
 - 83.01% Male
 - 60.34% Black/African American
 - 24.14% Living in a home/apartment
 - 75.86% Unstable living conditions

 Our Daily Bread responded by supplying take-out meals for guests, trying to bridge the gap in resources created by the pandemic.









IMPACT: HOW OUR DAILY BREAD HAS BEEN MEETING NEEDS

- With basic needs for food met, the guests are focused on long-term solutions for improving their situations. Let's continue this trend!










Decreased Accessibility: Gentrification

- Gentrification has restricted accessibility of resources for members of the community.
- Years of gentrification in OTR has been slowly displacing the original community members.
- 17% of Hamilton County suffer from severe housing problems
- 1 in 5 residents have felt dramatic effects of housing on their family's health.
- The Over the Rhine area has lost 73% of housing units considered "affordable".







Problems Facing Our Daily Bread

- Our Daily Bread is located in the heart of the downtown area.
- They are in a very valuable location due to recent gentrification.
- Georgine Getty, the director of Our Daily Bread, has been receiving pressure from nearby businesses to move Our Daily Bread.
- Our Daily Bread has been forced to restrict hours to 8 am – 12 pm on weekdays only.







Our Request:

- We believe that extending the operational hours of Our Daily Bread would further enhance its ability to serve our community effectively. This extension could provide a greater number of people with food resources throughout the day, as opposed to the currently limited hours of operation.
