Interests within obstetrics and gynecology?

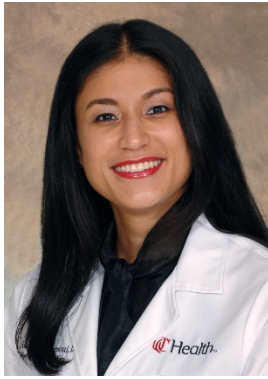

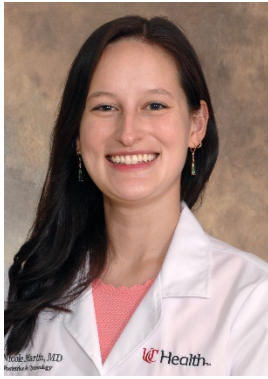
